

A HoT Job: Why Corporates Need a Head of Traceability

Questions for investors and lenders to ask management of companies

Recommended Questions

Q.1 What corporate-wide traceability system does the company use?

Background: Regulators are focusing on sustainability claims. New laws requiring robust traceability – e.g. deforestation-free products – are close to being implemented. Existing laws on modern day slavery and human trafficking carry substantial reputational risks.

Q.2 Do you have a Head of Traceability and where do they sit in the company's organisation chart?

Background: A Head of Traceability needs oversight of many different functions including: IT, product development, sourcing, legal, logistics, marketing and sustainability.

Q.3 Do management view traceability as an opportunity for profit enhancement?

Background: Although there are clearly costs associated with implementing a traceability system, there are considerable benefits including lower recall costs, reduced legal & regulatory costs, and improved operating margins.

Q.4 How can investors and lenders support the transition to being 100% traceable?

Background: Research suggests that corporate executives are keen to keep such roles hidden from investors and lenders as they provide a valuable insight into the operations of the company.
